2. What is your definition of fellowship? What is the bible definition of fellowship?

Is it fulfilling and (does it meet) the biblical definition of fellowship as "a sharing, communion or joint partnership"? What are the pros and cons?

4. In what was has meeting on video platforms called ecclesial traditions into question? What does is mean to be a member of an ecclesia or fellowship?

5. "They worshiped together at the Temple each day, met in homes for the Lord's Supper, and shared their meals with great joy and generosity. The NIV says - Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts." Acts 2:46
